AIP Johnson Business Scholarship

- Declared degree in Business or Business-related field
- Part-time students:
 1 Business class required (ACC, GBS, MGT, MKT)
- Full-time students: 2 Business classes required (ACC, GBS, MGT, MKT)
- FAFSA required*
- 2.0 CGPA

AIP Maricopa Grant STEAM, Management & Education Scholarship

- Declared major in STEAM: Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math, Management (outside of Business) or Education (taking classes within degree)
- FAFSA to determine need*
- 2.0 CGPA

AIP Merit Scholarship

- Declared degree (taking classes within degree)
- FAFSA to determine need*
- 3.5 or higher CGPA

* Filling out the FAFSA is recommended and REQUIRED for the AIP Johnson Business Scholarship.
