TRADITIONAL TEACHER IN TRAINING

Thank you for your interest in the **S**cottsdale **T**eacher **E**ducation **P**artnership **(STEP)** post-baccalaureate teacher certification program that is offered at Scottsdale Community College. This **Traditional Teacher in Training** pathway is a field-based immersion program where students learn alongside master teachers for a full year. It is based on the conviction that future teachers must have lengthy experience in schools to practice what they are learning in college. The Statewide Live Online option is available to those living outside of Maricopa County.

Students complete the program, which begins in May and ends the following May, as a cohort and are required to commit to the program for the full year. Classes are online and meet Wednesday and Thursday evenings from 5:00pm – 7:30pm.

From mid-May through July, students attend online classes through SCC. From August to February, students spend two consecutive full days at K-8 schools as an intern working side-by-side with teachers in classrooms (usually 7:30am – 3:00pm) and attend classes online through SCC. Homework and class preparation are in addition to these hours. Many candidates <u>substitute</u> teach on the days they are not interning in the classroom. Towards the end of the program, for twelve weeks from February to May, students spend five days per week student teaching full time at the school with no coursework at SCC.

When the completed application is submitted and a student is determined eligible for the program, an interview will be scheduled as the final part of the application process. Candidates will receive an email indicating acceptance into the program. Orientation takes place in April.

TEACHER IN RESIDENCE

Thank you for your interest in the **S**cottsdale **T**eacher **E**ducation **P**artnership **(STEP)** post-baccalaureate teacher certification program that is offered at Scottsdale Community College. This **Teacher in Residence** pathway allows students who have a bachelor's degree to sign a teaching contract and teach in the classroom while concurrently completing required education coursework leading towards certification. It is approved by the Arizona Department of Education and utilizes the Alternative Teaching Certificate. The Statewide Live Online option is available to those living outside of Maricopa County.

Students complete the program, which begins in May and ends the following May, as a cohort and are required to commit to the program for the full year. Classes are online and meet on Wednesday and Thursday evenings from 5:00pm – 7:30pm. The internships and twelve weeks of student teaching will be completed within the student's own classroom.

Students will work toward the following:

- Obtain the Fingerprint Clearance Card (AZDPS IVP).
- If required by the hiring school district, take and pass the <u>Elementary Education</u> Subtest I (NT102) and Subtest II (NT 103). These exams are not required for STEP program acceptance.
- Apply for and submit an <u>Application For Alternative Teaching Certificate</u> through the ADE website.
- Secure a full-time teaching position in a K-8 public, charter, or private school.

When the completed STEP application is submitted and a student is determined eligible for the program, an interview will be scheduled as the final part of the application process. Candidates will receive an email indicating acceptance into the program. Orientation takes place in April.
